

SUSTAINABILITY: THE CAPACITY TO ENDURE

The word sustainability describes how things endure and remain diverse and productive over time. Sustainability is an important concept to us at North St. Louis County Habitat for Humanity. When we serve our neighbors in need we have a desire to help them achieve sustainability. Together we achieve this by building an affordable AND energy efficient home. Sustainability in homeownership is not only found in a 0% mortgage. A home also has to be affordable to maintain in order to help a family endure the hurdles of difficult economic times.

North St. Louis County Habitat for Humanity made the commitment to build all of its homes according to the Minnesota Green Communities Guidelines in 2009. These guidelines affect the way in which we use building materials to minimize waste. There are also standards for using low VOC (volatile organic compounds) paints, adhesives and caulking that impact the health of our homeowners and volunteers. In building a home green, care is taken in the orientation of our homes to take advantage of the sun for light and heat. The use of energy star lights and appliances as well as the latest techniques in super insulating our homes insure that families can afford the ever rising utility costs.

Does building green work? Are Habitat homes affordable to maintain? Since our move to using the Minnesota Green Communities Guidelines we have tracked the performance of our homes. During the five coldest months of our northern Minnesota winter the average heating cost for a Habitat home was a grant total of \$350. The average electrical and gas costs for a Habitat home for the whole year was \$1470 or just \$122

per month. These numbers help families break the cycle of poverty as they thrive in a home which is sustainable.

As steps were being taken to build homes that were more sustainable, the board of directors was also addressing the issue of Habitat's ability to endure and thrive. Steps towards organizational sustainability have brought new faces to Habitat. Dave Alaspa our construction manager was hired in 2009 and Tom Long our resource development manager in 2011. This winter we have begun construction on an office and warehouse. The facility will bring efficiency to building operations as materials and tools will no longer be scattered across North St. Louis County. Adequate storage will also allow us to buy materials in bulk at better prices. The shop area will serve as a staging place for activities like staining trim and pre-building wall panels. Having the office located in a permanent location will eliminate the confusion and loss of productivity

that several moves have caused in the past. The goal in taking on this project is to ensure Habitat's efficiency, productivity and sustainability as we continue to grow to meet the needs of our neighbors.

Work on the facility started this winter through a partnership with the City of Mt. Iron and Northland Builders. Over 75% of the funds for the project have been secured and we are working to raise the additional 25% during this current year. The shell of the facility will be completed by contractors in April. We would love to have you, our wonderful supporters and volunteers, help us build sustainability for Habitat as we work to pour a floor and finish the interior early this summer.

Thank your for your support! Together we are growing stronger to help more families.

Since 2003 North St. Louis County Habitat for Humanity has been blessed with the talent of eight full time VISTA volunteers and six Summer VISTA volunteers. These wonderful people have helped our Habitat affiliate grow in the areas of Family Services, Church Relations, Volunteer and Construction Site Management.

We have been blessed with the opportunity to host VISTA positions again this year. We are currently seeking applicants to fill three positions.

The first is a position in communications and marketing that runs from August

2012 to August 2013. This 40 hour per week position will receive a monthly stipend of \$946 and an educational award of \$5500 at the end of the year and requires a college degree or experience in communications and marketing. The year of service will be focused on communicating key messages, updating and creating new publication templates as well as increasing the organization's online presence. It would be ideal for a person just getting out of college or someone who is semi-retired.

Secondly, we are looking to fill two stipend summer positions for the months of June and July to help lead volunteers in building activities.



There are quite a few of us at North St. Louis County Habitat for Humanity who are very enthusiastic about bicycles and building affordable homes. In fact, if you get us started on one of these topics I am sure that we could talk your ear off about either subject! We are more than happy to discuss what is the best kind of bike to ride or where are the best roads and trails. Get us started talking about affordable housing and we can visit with you for hours on topics like sustainable building practices and the impacts that a simple decent and affordable home has on a family in need.

When you combine the topics of bicycles and affordable homes we take

our conversations to a whole new level: that of the Habitat 500 fundraising bike ride. Over the years many of our board members, volunteers and staff have participated in this great event by either biking 500 miles in seven days or volunteering to raise funds and awareness for Habitat for Humanity projects. This year is shaping up to be an exceptional year for this biking event. Team NSLCHFH is bigger than it has ever been before. We are working to recruit twenty bike riders to come join us!

The event is a ride and not a race. Though 500 miles in seven days seems daunting it is more realistic when taken

in twenty mile intervals from rest stop to rest stop on the road. Participants approach their friends and family to raise at least \$900 towards home projects on the Range. Many of our riders raise much more than the minimum. Last year \$26,000 were raised to help our neighbors in need. Thank You!!
